Prayer is the oxygen of our relationship with God. It allows me to remember



Seasonal Recipe

Bang Bang Cauliflower

This seasonal dish turns the humble and rather bland cauliflower into a tangy and spicy dish. It uses panko breadcrumbs (which are essential).

They are made without the bread crusts and become crispy, providing a good crunch without deep-frying.

The Bang Bang sauce is savoury, sweet, and spicy and can be made very quickly using only four ingredients, with just a little whisking.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 cups cauliflower florets
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups panko breadcrumbs
- Salt and pepper
- 1 scallion thinly sliced (green onions or spring onions)

For the Bang Bang Sauce

- 2 tablespoons sweet chili sauce
- 2 teaspoons Sriracha hot sauce
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup non-fat plain Greek yogurt
- Garnish (chopped parsley or coriander)

STEPS TO TAKE

1. Gather ingredients and preheat the oven to 220°C/425°F.
2. Whisk together the eggs in a small bowl. Add the salt and pepper (about a teaspoon of each will do). Add about a teaspoon of water to thin out the eggs a little bit. The egg will stick better to the cauliflower this way.
3. Dip the cauliflower florets in the beaten eggs and coat them on all sides.
4. Drop the cauliflower florets into the panko breadcrumbs and toss to completely coat them. The panko should coat the cauliflower fairly easily, but if you need to, you can press some more of the breadcrumbs onto the cauliflower.
5. Place the coated cauliflower on a parchment lined baking sheet. Leave a little space between each floret.
6. Spray the cauliflower with cooking spray and then bake for 15-20 mins or until golden brown and crispy.
7. While the cauliflower is cooking, whisk together the ingredients for the Bang Bang sauce in a bowl.
8. To serve, drizzle the sauce over the crispy cauliflower and top with chopped scallions and parsley. Then serve immediately.



Meet the Neighbours

Angela Hannafin talks to long time Bardsey resident and Professor of Geology, Marjorie Wilson.



Marjorie, how long have you been living in Bardsey?

I originally came to Leeds in 1975 to work on my PhD at the University, and have lived in Bardsey with my husband Alastair since 1990. However, I'm actually a Lancastrian by birth!

How did you end up training as a geologist?

I looked into studying geology, but the message in the 1970's was "girls don't do geology", which I strongly reacted against! As a result, I read geology at St Hilda's College, Oxford. I then studied at Berkeley, University of California to get my Masters degree, which was challenging as I did a two-year course in one year.

I returned to the UK and started my PhD in Durham, before moving to Leeds, subsequently being appointed to a lectureship and becoming a professor in the mid-1990s.

You're the first volcanologist I've met. Can you explain what that is?

It's an expert on volcanoes. Much of my career has been dedicated to teaching and writing about volcanoes. I am fascinated by the sheer power of watching them erupt.

What did your career as a volcanologist entail?

As well as the teaching and writing, I've supervised many PhD students. I've also travelled extensively; to Cameroon, Zimbabwe, the Caribbean, China, South Africa and many places in Europe.

One of the most notable projects was being part of a small group of experts, funded by the Italian government, to distribute funding for the study of Italian volcanoes.

I was also the executive editor of a scientific journal, "Journal of Petrology", for twenty-five years.

What a busy career! I've met you more recently through your church involvement. How did that happen?

My faith in God was always there but I never had time to come to church. It was through the death of my husband, Alistair, in 2019, after thirty years of being together, that I became involved in the All Hallows community. I think I was probably a bit lost, and was warmly welcomed in, particularly by Brenda Sanderson and Helen Render.

I had some serious health issues this year too, which resulted in a triple heart bypass just before lockdown.

Faith and friends have enabled me to get through these difficult times.

How has Covid-19 impacted you?

Because of my health, I've had to shield for most of the year, which has been challenging. However, I've got through it with the support of friends, and my three step-children who are local. I'm also not an idle person, and have always got something to do!

Is there anything which life has taught you?

I'm naturally independent, and am good at adapting to new challenges. I'd say life has taught me to never give up! There is always more to learn and discover.

An Eco New Year Resolution

Many of you will have started the new year with a list of resolutions, some will be going well and some will have already been broken – either way as eco churches can we ask you to make a new one? To commit to becoming ‘greener’ in 2021.

Did you know that the average person in the UK is responsible for six* tonnes of CO₂ emissions per year, and we really need to reduce this to two tonnes if we are to avoid a climate crisis. And so we ask if you can spring clean your lives - starting by calculating your families carbon footprint.

You can do this at;

Or for a more comprehensive assessment try;

www.carbonfootprint.com/calculator.aspx

Then look to see what you can do to reduce your footprint. You may already know about many of the suggestions listed here but may not have got around to it yet - so why not make 2021 the year that you do?

There are so many more things you can do. So resolve that this is the year to make the change.

**Excludes emissions from goods and services that we consume but which are produced outside the UK, which can add a further 4 tonnes to the average person's carbon footprint.*

Have a green spring clean

- When your light bulbs need changing switch to LED and save energy.
- Remember to recycle and always try to repair rather than replace.
- Wash your clothes at 30°C and air dry if possible.
- Don't leave electrical appliances on standby – turn off when not in use.
- When utility contracts are due for renewal switch to a green supplier.
- Buy local and seasonal and avoid products that have been imported into the UK.
- Try to walk, cycle or use public transport for a regular journey at least once a week.
- Turn down your home thermostat to 18-21°C and only heat the rooms you use.
- When the summer comes – and it will – don't use a hose to water your garden, get a water butt.
- And think about taking holidays locally to avoid air miles.

Let us know how you get on and become part of our parish eco-church family.

While they might not be ideal, I will still continue to run the practices for choir members and I'm more than happy for




our numbers to increase. In normal times there are up to 20 of us but we regularly have 12 on Zoom. We have both men and women singing and meet on a Thursday evening.

Two years ago the redundant telephone box in Church Lane was converted into a library by Bardsey Parish Council, who approached Bardsey Women's Institute to look after it.

The library has proved to be very popular and when Covid-19 struck, a year ago it was decided to leave the library open and see if it was used.

It has been used even more, so while many are restricted in their activities, reading has become a lifeline.

The Women's Institute are grateful to Val Hobbs for keeping the library tidy and supplied with books. Fiction books and children's books are most popular. Technical books don't tend to be taken and they take up a lot of space, so we prefer not to have them.

Delivery men are often seen perusing the reading matter on their rounds.

There is no obligation to replace any book that is taken and the library works best if books are not returned but passed on to family or friends. Different books are welcome so that a turnover of titles is achieved.

If you haven't taken any books have a look next time you are passing, as there are many good titles, all in excellent condition.
